JUMBO PACIFIC CAPTURES HERITAGE PLACE FUTURITY

Albert and Shirley Hogoboom owned the second, third and sixth place finishers in the first running of the Heritage Place Futurity, held November 5 at Blue Ribbon Downs. In fact, the couple from El Dorado, Kansas had owned the winner of the race — Jumbo Pacific — until just a few days before the finals.

Jumbo Pacific set the fastest qualifying time in the trials, gliding over a sloppy 400 yards in 20.29 seconds. That caught the eye of Dan Urschel of Canadian, Texas. Hogoboom told TRACK that five days later he and Urschel struck a deal for \$200,000, and the gelding had a new owner. The Hogoboos were to receive 25 percent of the horse's earnings from the futurity.

Most folks figured Jumbo Pacific to be the favorite in the finals. He was sent off from the seventh post position with Steve Harris in the saddle.

Hogoboom said the gelding left the gates in good shape, as he usually does. He took over the lead about halfway down the track, and then kicked it in high gear, daylighting the field. "The farther he runs, the better," Hogoboom said.

The winning time for the 400-yard sprint was 20.09 seconds, which represents a 99 speed index.

So, in the tradition of other horses Urschel has paid big money for — like Pie In The Sky, Mighty Deck Three and, oh yes, Special Effort — Jumbo Pacific immediately proved to be a good investment.

The total purse for the futurity final

was \$366,035.87. Jumbo Pacific picked up the winner's share of \$161,361, pushing his career earnings to almost \$216,000. He has won 10 races in 15 starts, with two seconds and a third place finish.

"He's a real nice colt," Urschel told TRACK immediately following the race. "We thought he had a good chance of winning. But everything in a horse race is uncertain till it's over. We feel like the Lord has really helped us."

After Jumbo Pacific was led back to his barn and most of the crowd had left the winner's circle, Guy Ray Rutland leaned on a rail, grinning, and told TRACK the horse was not always so well thought of.

Rutland, of Independence, Kansas, said he raised the son of Pacific Bailey. He said he still owns the dam, Jumbo Jewel, who was a sprinting Thoroughbred by Shining. "I believe he was her first Quarter Horse foal," he said.

Rutland tried to sell Jumbo Pacific as a weanling colt in his annual production sale. But when the horse failed to attract a bid of more than \$900, Rutland said he decided to keep him for a while.

"I thought he would make a race horse. In my comments in the sale catalog I said this colt looked like Pacific Bailey did when I couldn't sell him for \$400, even though I kept telling everybody he'd make a great race horse."

A few days after the sale, Rutland had Jumbo Pacific gelded. "I decided I'd just show 'em a race horse," he said.

Rutland said he sold Jumbo Pacific as a yearling to Joe Thomas who bought the horse for Albert Hogoboom. The purchase price this time was \$2,500.

Rutland said he had bought the

gelding's dam, Jumbo Jewel, from Joe Thomas, who trains for Hogoboom.

Hogoboom said the gelding had some rough luck in some of his early starts, including a collision in the Laddie Futurity trials at Garfield Downs last April. In May, Jumbo Pacific set the fastest time for the Flinthills Futurity at Eureka Downs, but the track was sloppy in the finals, and Hogoboom said his horse flipped in the gates.

Jumbo Pacific's first major victory came last June when he daylighted the field in the Northeast Kansas Quarter Horse Association Futurity. Then in July, he took a three-length victory in the Kansas-Bred Futurity, setting a track record for 350 yards. His winning time was 17.53 seconds which computes to a 105 speed index.

When Urschel purchased Jumbo Pacific, Marvin Brown took over the training duties. In late-November, Urschel told TRACK the horse was in training at his ranch, under the supervision of Leo Wood, who might take the gelding to Sunland Park and pay the late fees to enter him in the Sunland Fall Futurity trials (finals scheduled for December 20).

"We'll just have to wait and see," Urschel said. "After that, we'll rest him for a while. He's had a lot of outs. We'll take him to Los Alamitos next summer."

As mentioned earlier in this story, the Hogoboos own both the runnerup and third place finisher in the Heritage Place Futurity. Both horses were trained by Joe Thomas.

Excessive Power, ridden by Henry Wiley, collected \$59,449 for second place. That gives the colt a record of 8-3-2 from 17 starts, and earnings of

more than \$70,000. Last July, he won the Thayer Laddie Futurity in Nebraska.

The Hogoboos bought Excessive Power at last year's Heritage Place Yearling Sale for \$3,000. The colt was consigned by Mighty Acres, Pryor, Oklahoma. He is by Mighty Deck out of a Clabber Bar mare named Sorrel Seeker.

Three weeks after the Heritage Place Futurity, Excessive Power ran second in the Green Country Allowance at Blue Ribbon Downs, and earned almost \$5,000. He set the fastest qualifying time in the trials for the race.

Third place was worth \$29,724 to First Session, who was ridden by Jack Hopkins. The Hempen gelding is out of Smooth Pebble, by Jet Smooth. First

Session was another graduate of the Heritage Place Yearling Sale. Consigned by Walter Merrick, the gelding brought Hogoboom's top bid of \$4,500.

First Session ran second to Excessive Power in the Thayer Laddie Futurity. With earnings of over \$32,000, the gelding has finished in the money in each of his nine starts, with four wins, one second and four third place finishes. It will be a while before First Session will run again, however. Hogoboom said the gelding cracked a canon bone during the Heritage Place Futurity, and he wasn't sure when he would race again.

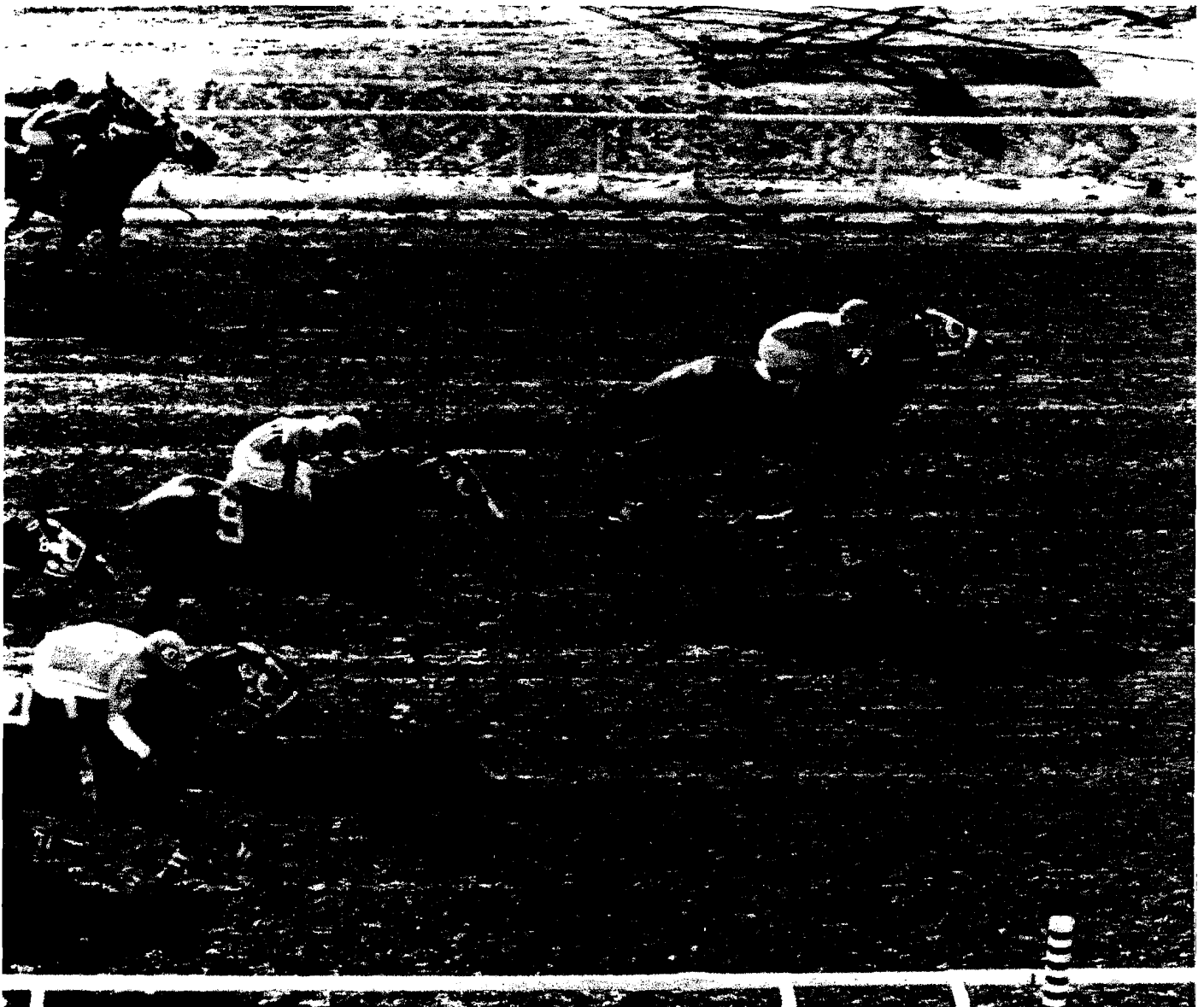
"I thought I might be lucky enough to get a couple of horses in the finals, but I was really surprised when we qualified

four," Hogoboom said. "Jumbo Pacific and Excessive Power had both set track records and won futurities, so I figured they had a shot at it. I knew I had some good horses in the race, but it takes a lot of luck."

When asked about all the money he had won after the race, Hogoboom replied, "Now I've got enough to go buy a hamburger."

However, he went to the track office and had to borrow a nickel to have enough money to call some relatives and inform them of the race results. "Isn't that terrible," he said while dialing the number on the pay-phone "Won all that money and don't have a nickel."

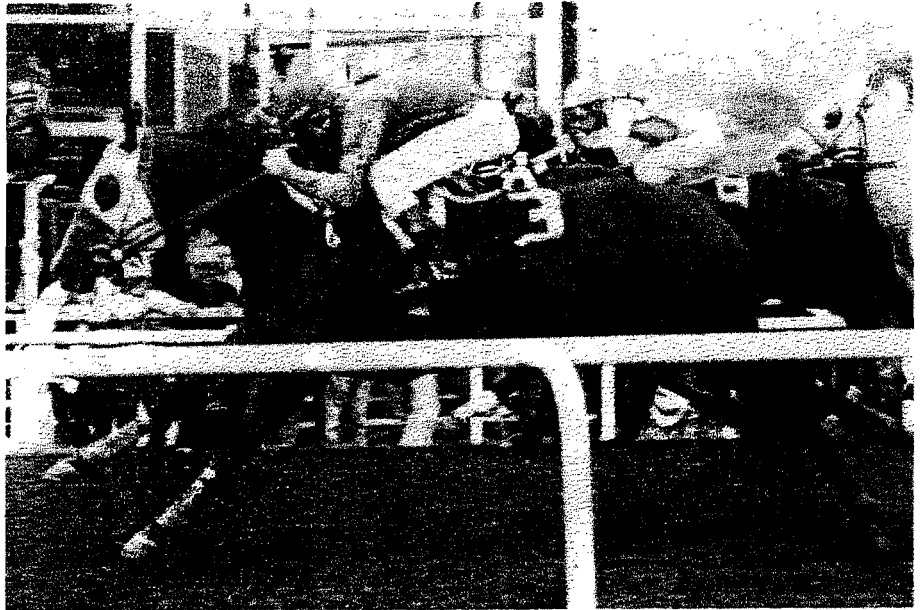

Running fourth was Spectular Rhythm, who collected \$21,232. The Easy Jet filly has three wins and three second place finishes in 10 starts, with earnings of almost \$75,000. Owned by Blairwood Farms, Spectular Rhythm finished seventh in this year's All American Futurity. She was ridden by Bobby Winklepleck in the Heritage Place Futurity and trained by Lee Gladd.

John Boys Alive ran fifth, picking up \$18,259. Betty Shebester and John Ringer own the son of Bugs Alive In 75. The gelding was ridden by Jerry Goss and trained by Marvin Brown.

Beau Boomer's sixth place finish was worth \$17,410 to the Hogoboos. Also trained by Joe Thomas, the colt was ridden by Glen Melson. Beau Boomer is by Lady's Jet Man.

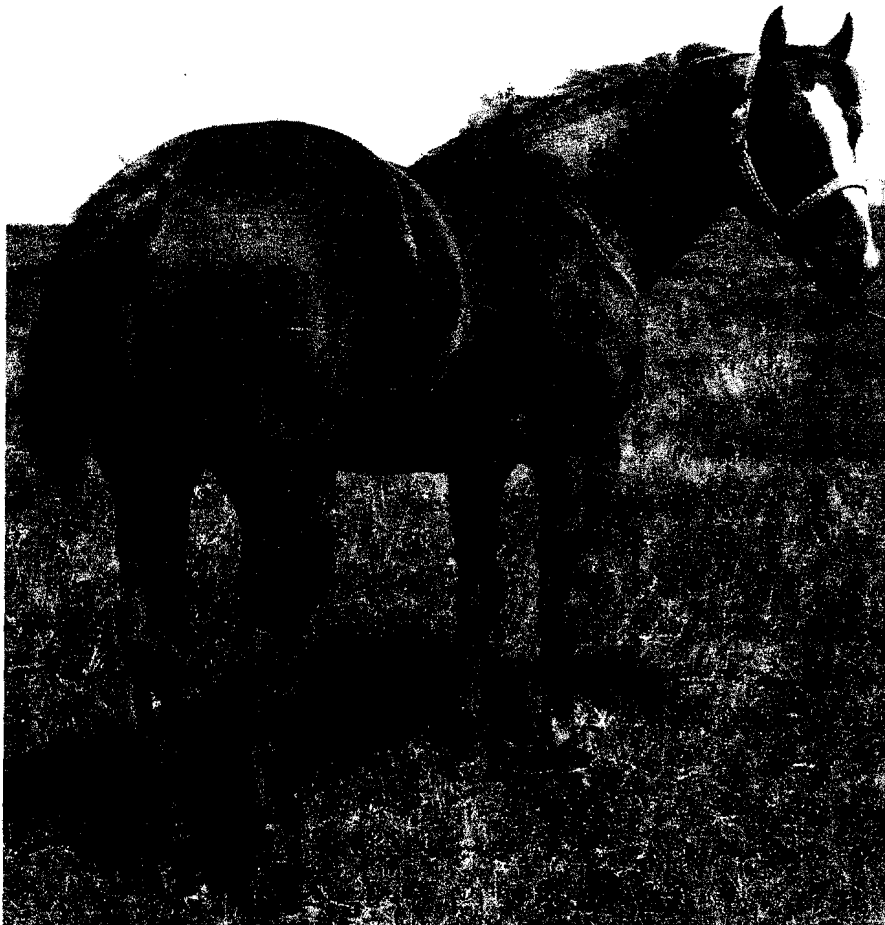
