

Rutland Horse Top Winner On Fair Circuit

Gold King Bailey Has Good Season In Quarter Horse Races

Gold King Bailey, speedy seven-year-old Palimino quarter horse belonging to Guy Rutland, R.R. 1, city, has been cleaning up in fair races over the country, his owner said yesterday.

Rutland has just returned from the Vigo county fair at Terre Haute, Indiana, and also the Indianapolis state fair in that city. Using Willie Hunt, a jockey from Broken Bow, Okla., Rutland's well known Palimino ran off with first place prizes in the 220-yd. dashes.

It is interesting to note that Gold King Bailey ran his first race August 7 at Enid, after being crippled about a year and a half ago.

At Terre Haute Rutland sponsored a futurity race (one in which stakes to be raced for long after the nominations or entries are made, the competitors being often nominated before birth) in which five colts from Gold King Bailey were entered. Salty King won the event, and later won the 330-yd. open at the Indianapolis fair for two-year-olds. Rutland had previously sold the five colts, however.

The fast Gold King Bailey also won a race at Pawhuska, Okla., last week, Rutland said. He plans to enter the Palimino in several more races yet this year.
